# Fall 2023 Grants Total Over \$684,000

This fall, the GLCF received a record 95 applications for grant funding. The GLCF Distribution Committee carefully reviewed each application, resulting in over \$492,000 awarded in competitive grants, plus another \$189,790 in recommendations from our donor advised funds.

Competitive grants ranged from \$24,000 to \$1,000, with an average grant of \$6,300. The GLCF provides grants for a wide range of needs, including food/hunger, housing, education, individuals with disabilities, animal welfare, historic preservation, our environment, and the arts.

"This was a tough year for making grant decisions," said Carl Boggess, GLCF's Distribution Committee chair. "There are so many worthy organizations asking for support, and the amounts requested have increased."

**Donor advised funds** allow the fund's advisor to make recommendations for grants. "My siblings and I have been honored to serve as advisors to a donor advised fund that was created through the generosity of our grandparents," says Charlie White of Lynchburg, who advises the Kenneth L. & Bertha S. White Fund.

"This experience has reinforced a commitment to our community across generations in our family, which was important to Pete and Bertha Mae White. We are very proud to play a small role in furthering their legacy of support for the disadvantaged in Lynchburg, and we hope that they would be proud of the decisions that we have made in distributing funds to so many important causes over the years."

Virginia Amateur Sports received a grant of \$2,500 from the GLCF in 2023 for their Inclusive Sports Movement Program, which provided an opportunity for individuals with a physical and/or intellectual disability to participate in a division of the Virginia Commonwealth Games called the "Able Games."

As a result of the grant, 161 individuals participated at no charge, and received medals honoring their efforts.

# **FUND SPOTLIGHT**

The Jim Bibby Memorial Fund was established in 2021 in honor of local baseball legend Jim Bibby. Mr. Bibby was a Major League Baseball pitcher from 1972 to 1984 with the St. Louis Cardinals, Texas Rangers, Cleveland Indians, and Pittsburgh Pirates.

After Mr. Bibby died in 2010, his family hosted golf tournaments to raise funds for various causes that honored his legacy. When those became too much to manage, an endowed fund at the GLCF was created as a simpler option with a long-term impact. The fund provides grants for local nonprofits in the field of health and wellness. "I continue to support the GLCF," says Jackie Bibby, Mr. Bibby's widow. "It's a good way of giving back to our community."
