The mission of The Community Trust is to enhance the quality of life in the communities served by establishment of permanent endowments for the city of Lynchburg and the counties of Amherst, Appomattox, Bedford and Campbell, with income distributed annually to charitable organizations within the community.

The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust

The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust provides for the administration and the investment of gifts and bequests for the benefit of the city of Lynchburg and the counties of Amherst, Appomattox, Bedford, and Campbell. Needs served are broad in scope including human services to children, youth, the needy, and the elderly; education; health; the arts; and the humanities.

The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust exists to promote local philanthropy and to simplify the process of giving. The Trust receives and manages permanent gifts for the perpetual benefit of the Greater Lynchburg area.

The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust currently consists of 228 Special and Unrestricted Funds. Trust assets are managed by: SunTrust, BB&T, Bank of America, Wells Fargo, Flippin Bruce & Porter, Wells Fargo Advisors, First Citizens, Davidson & Garrard and Pettyjohn, Wood & White.

The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust is one of more than 750 such community foundations over the nation rendering a valuable service to their respective communities and to donors interested in the present and future of their communities and their neighbors.

President's Wessage

The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust's fiscal year ending June 30, 2014 was a year of healthy growth. Total assets grew 15.2% to \$36.8 million by year end. During the year, the Board of Directors initiated a Strategic Planning Process to identify key areas of focus for the next three to five years. As a result of this process, The Community Trust developed several valuable improved processes in the areas of development, distribution, and investment. The Board of Directors also adopted a new Vision Statement – "Mobilizing Philanthropy to Meet Community Needs."

Since its founding in 1972, generous donors have given \$33.2 million to The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust. This has enabled us to help those in need and to support the arts, education, and historical preservation in our area for over 42 years. Since our current spending policy of 5% is based on the twelve quarter average market value, we are able to make our annual distributions to the community in a stable and consistent manner regardless of the current economic conditions at any particular point in time. We are able to grant funds when the economy may experience a downturn when funds are drastically needed. In other words, The Community Trust provides a relatively steady and dependable funding source from year to year. During the fiscal year ending June 30, 2014 our Distribution Committee awarded grants totaling \$1,521,165, compared to \$1,363,719 the prior year.

However, we need your help! In order for us to continue this trend and increase our support of much-needed programs in our community, we must continue to have generous gifts like we have had in the past. A gift to The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust is a powerful gift because we are an endowment fund, and your gift will support our community in perpetuity, that is, forever. It is the best investment you can make in your community.

During the June 30, 2014 fiscal year we received contributions of \$1,062,811. Donors to The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust have the satisfaction that their gifts will continue to benefit future generations. And these donors, their families, and their causes will be remembered forever through named funds. The establishment of a named fund is a wonderful way to advance one's philanthropic interests and to leave a legacy.

The Community Trust's Strategic Planning Process

During our 2013-2014 fiscal year, the 16-member Board of Directors of The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust initiated a Strategic Planning Process to identify key areas of focus for the next three to five years. On September 10, 2013 the board and staff held an interactive Strategic Planning Session at the Craddock Terry Hotel. Participants took into consideration the experiences of the past, the current state of the organization, potential risks, and where and how the organization desires to grow. Participants identified strengths to be leveraged and weaknesses to be bolstered. Looking ahead toward the future, opportunities for growth and preparedness for possible threats were identified. In addition to improved organization processes, three areas of focus were identified that resulted into three task forces (Development, Distribution, and Investment). The task forces reported their findings to the full board during the year. At the final board meeting of the fiscal year on June 10, 2014, the Board of Directors approved the organization's Vision Statement.

A Sampling of Our Funds

The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust administers 228 individually named funds. These funds are established to support our community grantmaking, support organizations recommended by the donor, or provide ongoing support for one or more specified charitable organizations. Individual funds range from \$10,000 to over \$5 million, and they serve a wide range of community needs.

The Boys & Girls Club of Greater Lynchburg Fund - \$52,775

The Boys & Girls Club of Greater Lynchburg established their endowment fund at The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust in 2009 with a lead gift from Lynn and Jim Daly who are strong supporters of the Boys & Girls Club and youth development programs. Following their lead, the board voted to commit to the long-term growth of the endowment fund to help ensure the long-term viability of the Boys & Girls Club. With this option, patrons and supporters can choose to help the club continue its mission to provide a safe, secure and positive place for the youth of Lynchburg to grow and realize their full potential for years into the future. The club offers young people what they need and want most: adults who respect and listen to them; a safe environment where they can have fun; and interesting, constructive activities that channel youthful energy into challenging pursuits. An initial \$5,000 gift has grown to almost \$50,000 to help ensure the long-term viability of the Boys & Girls Club of Greater Lynchburg. The establishment of an endowment fund provides annual income for an organization and is a strong indication of financial stability.



Margaret and Bill Quillian

The Quillian-Weigle Fund - \$113,774

In 1994, Bill and Margaret Quillian established The Quillian-Weigle Fund named for their parents. Bill's father was a Methodist minister who was President of Wesleyan College in Macon, Georgia. Margaret's father was the Dean of the Yale Divinity School. Both Bill, a graduate of Emory University with B.D. and Ph.D. degrees from Yale, and Margaret, a graduate of Vassar, came from backgrounds where education and community service were very important. The Quillians made an initial gift of \$5,000 to establish the fund, and they made gifts occasionally on birthdays, holidays, and at special events. Bill and Margaret's wish was that the fund would grow to a size that would make a difference in our community. Bill would often speak to community groups, and he always stated that "my fund has grown over time, and if you establish your own fund, it will also grow over time. You can also make a difference in our community." Bill was The Community Trust's greatest ambassador. His fund has since grown to \$113,774, and will continue to grow over time. The Quillian-Weigle Fund supports services and programs that enhance the quality of life of all citizens in Central Virginia in perpetuity.

George Murphy

The George H. Murphy Fund - \$15,443

George Murphy served as President & CEO of The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust from 2004-2007. The George H. Murphy Fund was established after his death in 2008 by his friends and family. The fund is an unrestricted fund, but primarily supports agencies and programs in the Bedford area. George and his wife Barbara made Bedford their home in 2000 after living in Alabama, Boston, Dallas, Atlanta, Chicago, Montreal, and New York. George had a long career in the newsprint business which started in 1963 with International Paper Company and retired as Vice President with Avenor America, Inc. when the Murphys moved to Bedford in 2000. Barbara ran a successful catering business along the way in their various communities. George and Barbara became enthusiastic citizens of their adopted community in Bedford. Thus, the fund supports worthwhile projects and programs, primarily in the Bedford area. And the Murphys leave a legacy that will last forever.

The Dunbar High School Legacy Fund - \$125,984

The Dunbar High School Legacy Fund, a scholarship fund, was established to award one-time scholarships to Lynchburg public high school seniors who exemplify the kind of high standards of excellence and sense of civic responsibility that helped create the rich legacy of the former Paul Laurence Dunbar High School (1923-1970). To be considered for a scholarship, the candidate must meet certain requirements. He or she must be a well-rounded Lynchburg public high school senior who has a firm commitment from one or more four-year universities or colleges. He or she must have demonstrated consistent high level academic achievement as evidenced by objective measurements such as GPA, Honor Roll, and other awards and recognitions. Financial need is also considered. The candidate must also write a short essay about some aspect of the former Dunbar High School's history. It is suggested that the candidate focus on an alumni, teacher, coach, principal, or event. Thirteen scholarships have been awarded from The Dunbar High School Legacy Fund since it was established in 2005. These outstanding students and their contributions to our community serve to keep alive the spirit of Dunbar High School in Lynchburg.

A Sampling of Our Crants in 2014

In 2014, The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust awarded \$1,521,165 to 140 charitable organizations. Our grants support the four major human service areas identified by our needs assessment study – Successful Children and Youth, Strengthening Families and Individuals, Healthy and Independent Living, and People in Crisis Receiving Help. In addition, our grants support the Arts, Education, and Historical Preservation.

The Grantmaking Process - \$649,832

During its 41-year history, The Community Trust has provided grants totaling \$15.8 million to help those in need and to support the arts, education and historical preservation in Central Virginia. A large portion of those dollars are determined by The Community Trust's Distribution Committee whose current members include Gus Petticolas, Chair; John Alford, Jr., MaryJane Dolan, Rob Finch, Ernie Guill, Hank Hubbard, Jim Richards, Massie Ware, and Jim Wright. The committee reviews over 100 grant applications over the fall cycle (September 15 deadline) and the spring cycle (March 15 deadline). The Distribution Committee approved \$649,832 in grants to community organizations in 2014. As a result of the committee's conscientious work, the grantmaking process is thorough, fair, and effective in meeting needs in our community. The Community Trust regularly conducts needs assessment studies to ensure that community needs are accurately and effectively addressed in the process. Our community owes a debt of gratitude to our all-volunteer Distribution Committee for their hard work.

Wheels on the James - \$4,000

Wheels on the James was started in April 2011 by Nancy Wellons with an initial board of seven additional people. Nancy wanted to pass forward one of the many kindnesses shown to her son, Cpt. James Howard, army retired, who sustained a spinal cord injury from a diving accident at age 28 leaving him a quadriplegic. James received a therapeutic cycle in a bike ride sponsored for disabled veterans and others. The mission of Wheels on the James is to provide similar cycles to disabled children, teens, adults, wounded warriors, and schools with special needs students in Lynchburg and the surrounding area. For the recipients, these donated cycles will open doors to independence, mobility, and recreational exercise. The Community Trust's \$4,000 grant, along with gifts from other generous donors, has enabled the organization to provide more than 100 therapeutic cycles in Central Virginia.

Miller Home of Lynchburg - \$10,800

Miller Home has cared for more than 900 girls since opening its doors in 1875. When established by Samuel Miller, the Miller Home was known as the Lynchburg Female Orphan Asylum. At that time the home was located in a four story building on a working farm. The home currently cares for girls ages four through twentyone. They strive to provide the most traditional family environment possible while meeting the special individual needs of each resident. The residents come to Miller Home for various reasons, from counties, towns, and cities all over Virginia as well as other states. In some cases, it is the resident's behavior that necessitates placement, while in other situations the parent or guardian is unable to care for her. Whatever the reason, each situation is considered separately. A diverse population is served through the program, and variety within the home is what makes the family special. Miller Home does not accept federal, state or local money, and their choice to remain a private home allows them to serve children whose families are without the resources to pay for group home care. A sliding scale is used to determine the amount of family support. The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust has made numerous grants to Miller Home for programs and capital improvements over the years to help young girls who need assistance.

Bedford Community Christmas Station - \$8,000

Bedford Community Christmas Station responds to the needs of the community by ensuring that low-income families are able to provide household members with the necessities of life. Located in the new Ethel Young Childers Building at 510 Blue Ridge Avenue in Bedford, the Christmas Station assists low-income families on a seasonal basis by providing a shopping experience characterized by choice and dignity. Serving families with children is the highest priority. The Christmas Station is set up like a department store, with sections for infants, girls and boys clothing, teen clothing, gifts, toys, household items and food. Each family that is accepted to shop at the Christmas Station also receives a box of food. The Christmas Station is not just a holiday season event but a year-long program to support needs in the community. The year-long food pantry is open two days per week to serve families on an emergency basis. Additionally, Easter food and accessory boxes and back-to-school assistance include school supplies and shoes. The Community Trust's numerous grants to the Bedford Community Christmas Station over the years have provided much needed assistance to low-income families in our area.

Types of *Funds*

The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust offers a variety of simple, flexible, and effective options for those who wish to provide financial support to our community through philanthropy.

Types of Funds:

Unrestricted Fund

Contributions made with no restrictions provide income for grants made by the Distribution Committee in response to requests from area non-profit organizations.

Field of Interest Fund

The donor specifies areas of interest (youth, elderly, education, arts, medical, etc.) to be supported by the fund.

Donor Designated Fund

At the time of establishing a fund the donor may name the organization(s) or institution(s) to be its beneficiaries.

Donor Advised Fund

The donor may from time to time suggest specific grants to be made from his/her fund.

Scholarship Fund

Enables donor to establish an endowment to fund annual scholarships.

Temporary Fund

Funds created when assets are delivered to The Trust with the expectation that they will ultimately be distributed for charitable purposes.

Operating Endowment

The income from this fund is used to help meet The Trust's operating costs, thereby increasing the amount available for charitable distribution.

Our Jouth Philanthropy Program

The goal of The Community Trust Youth Philanthropy Program is to instill in our youth awareness of our community needs and the importance of volunteering and philanthropy.

Two seniors, one male and one female, from 11 high schools within The Community Trust's service area serve for one year on The Youth Philanthropy Committee of The Community Trust and are responsible for granting \$10,000 or more to deserving local charitable organizations that serve the needs of youth in our area. The students are nominated to this program by faculty and staff of their respective school based on their demonstration of excellence in academics, leadership, and community service.

The committee is supervised by Community Trust board members and meets periodically throughout the school year. The students review grant applications, rate the applications, perform site visits of the top 8 applicants and prepare presentations on these applications for the committee as a whole. From this process, a final vote is taken to determine which agency will receive the grant.








Total Investments:




The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust was founded October 12, 1972 with three funds and a total value of \$14,000. Foundation assets have grown from \$702,000 on September 30, 1992 to \$36,287,920 by year-end June 30, 2014. The Foundation grew from 16 funds to 228 funds during the same period. We credit our success to our donors, volunteer board members and advisors who saw the value of The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust and encouraged their friends and clients to consider establishing long-term philanthropic funds with The Trust.

Operating Expenses as a Percent of Total Investments (Trailing Three-Year Average)




Keeping operating expenses to a minimum is a priority of The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust. This includes general and administrative costs, fund raising expenses, and program costs.
