The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust provides for the administration and the investment of gifts and bequests for the benefit of the city of Lynchburg and the counties of Amherst, Appomattox, Bedford, and Campbell. Needs served are broad in scope including human services to children, youth, the needy, and the elderly; education; health; the arts; and the humanities.

The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust exists to promote local philanthropy and to simplify the process of giving. The Trust receives and manages permanent gifts for the perpetual benefit of the Greater Lynchburg area.

President's *Message*

It has been my distinct honor and privilege to serve as President & CEO of the Greater Lynchburg Community Trust for the past seven years. I announced my plans to retire as of June 30, 2015. My successor, Bill Bodine, and I have had a productive and effective 30-day transition period during June. I am confident that the Greater Lynchburg Community Trust is in good hands. We have seen tremendous growth in the number of programs and initiatives that we have supported in Central Virginia over the years. Our total assets are now over \$36 million, and we are now awarding grants of over \$1.5 million annually.

Since its founding in 1972, generous donors have given \$33.9 million to the Greater Lynchburg Community Trust. This has enabled us to help those in need and to support the arts, education, and historical preservation in our area for over 43 years. Since our current spending policy of 5% is based on the twelve quarter average market value, we are able to make our annual distributions to the community in a stable and consistent manner regardless of the current economic conditions at any particular point in time. We are able to grant funds when the economy may experience a downturn when funds are drastically needed. The Community Trust provides a steady and dependable funding source from year to year.

In order for us to continue this trend and increase our support of much-needed programs in our community, we must continue to have generous gifts like we have had in the past. A gift to the Greater Lynchburg Community Trust is a powerful

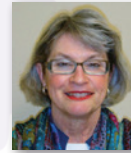

Our *Youth Philanthropy* Program

The goal of the Community Trust Youth Philanthropy Program is to instill in our youth awareness of our community needs and the importance of volunteering and philanthropy.

Two seniors, one male and one female, from 11 high schools within the Community Trust's service area serve for one year on the Youth Philanthropy Committee of the Community Trust and are responsible for granting \$10,000 or more to deserving local charitable organizations that serve the needs of youth in our area. The students are nominated to this program by faculty and staff of their respective school based on their demonstration of excellence in academics, leadership, and community service.

The committee is supervised by Community Trust board members and meets periodically throughout the school year. The students review grant applications, rate the applications, perform site visits of the top 8 applicants and prepare presentations on these applications for the committee as a whole. From this process, a final vote is taken to determine which agency will receive the grant.

A Sampling of Our *Funds*

The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust administers 234 individually named funds. These funds are established to support our community grantmaking, support organizations recommended by the donor, or provide ongoing support for one or more specified charitable organizations. Individual funds range from \$10,000 to over \$6 million, and they serve a wide range of community needs.



Appomattox Train Station

Appomattox Fund: \$20,787

In 2003, Appomattox County was added to the Greater Lynchburg Community Trust's area of service when a group of dedicated citizens got together to establish a fund. The Jamerson, Puckett, Conner, and Tanner families were the first to contribute to this fund, which has grown since then to almost \$21,000. The Appomattox Fund was initially set up as a field of interest fund and has been used to provide scholarships for deserving Appomattox County High School students and provide many other benefits to the county. The Appomattox Fund is a wonderful example of how groups of people committed to their communities can create positive change through forward thinking.



George and Gladys Costan

George and Gladys Costan Family Scholarship Fund: \$46,943

The Costan Family Scholarship Fund was established in 2009. Income from the fund is distributed for the purpose of establishing and maintaining scholarships for graduating seniors from E. C. Glass and Heritage High Schools. These scholarships are specifically to assist students with low to moderate family income, a minimum GPA of 2.5, are accepted at an accredited 4 year college, 2 year junior college, community college, or trade school, and those who have been active volunteers in church or the community at large. The students must show independence, self-discipline, respect for themselves and others, and a love for learning. We are grateful for the generosity of the Costan family and all those who have helped by contributing to this fund.



Virginia State Alumni

Virginia State University Alumni Chapter of Central Virginia Scholarship Fund: \$10,888

Christine Petticolas headed a group of interested people in establishing this wonderful new scholarship fund. It was set up for the purpose of establishing and maintaining scholarships for graduates of high schools in central Virginia, as determined and selected by the fund's scholarship committee. This fund is a fine example of a group of committed people coming together to provide a lasting benefit to the community and our society at large.



Christine and Hank Hubbard

Hylan and Christine Hubbard Family Fund: \$100,308

This fund was made possible through the generosity of Lynchburg colleagues of Christine and Hank who benefitted directly from the caring and guidance of local communities, families, churches, and the Lynchburg City School System, culminating with the Hubbards' experiences at the former legendary Dunbar High School. The fund will be used to remove some of the obstacles that prevent many Lynchburg children from participating in pre-kindergarten programs which are essential to establishing the proper foundation for strong educational and socialization skills. It is meant to complement the many other programs and initiatives which serve Lynchburg children.

A Sampling of Our *Grants* in 2015

In 2015, the Greater Lynchburg Community Trust awarded \$1,569,570 to 141 charitable organizations. Our grants support the four major human service areas identified by our needs assessment study – Successful Children and Youth, Strengthening Families and Individuals, Healthy and Independent Living, and People in Crisis Receiving Help. In addition, our grants support the Arts, Education, and Historical Preservation.



Park View Community Mission - \$12,500

Park View Community Mission is a ministry of the Lynchburg District of the Virginia Conference United Methodist Church and is located in the Park View Methodist Church in mid-town Lynchburg. PVCMM assists over 700 families per month with a shopping cart full of eggs, meat, vegetables, and canned goods from food banks, churches, and area grocery stores and restaurants. Based on Feeding America initiatives found in several larger cities, Park View's Food for Families program provides supplemental groceries to families that are food insecure. By partnering with the Blue Ridge Area Food Bank and Feeding America, Park View Community Mission is able to make available essential food items such as fresh produce and eggs and baked goods on a client choice basis. This means that families take an active part in selecting the foods they take home. The Food for Families pantry is open select hours on Thursdays and Saturdays and there are Wednesday night meals each week. The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust is proud to have been able to provide \$12,500 this past year to help with the purchase of a van for the Food for Families program.



Poplar Forest - \$5,500

As one of only two homes Thomas Jefferson designed and created for his own use, Poplar Forest's value to history and architecture is immeasurable. Formed in 1983, the nonprofit Corporation for Jefferson's Poplar Forest was able to rescue the declining home and surrounding 50 acres and open it to the public in 1986. Since then, important archeological exploration and restoration have resulted in tremendous educational opportunities to further discover Jefferson's inventive and architectural genius. Poplar Forest has been recognized by the National Trust for Historic Preservation with its Honor Award and the restoration is considered one of the most important projects in the country within the professional preservation community. Educational programs, theatre performances, and local festivals have all been held there and the Greater Lynchburg Community Trust provided \$5,500 to assist in these endeavors.



James River Association - \$4,500

The single biggest threat to the quality of our waterways, including the James River, is stormwater runoff and the pollutants it carries into the river. The James River Association, among many other efforts, is working to establish, restore, and/or enhance streamside buffers throughout the watershed. Healthy, vegetated buffers along a stream help remove pollutants that would otherwise flow into the river. They also serve to provide good natural habitats for a variety of wildlife, including fish, wading fowl, and bald eagles. The James River Association has planted tens of thousands of trees, bushes, and plants over miles of shoreline and one recent effort involved a streambank stabilization project in Campbell County. This is just one example of the many projects undertaken by the James River Association to ensure the health of one of our area's greatest natural resources. The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust has been a proud supporter of these initiatives and in 2015 provided a grant of \$4,500 that was used for the purchase of canoes in the Association's educational programming.



Beacon of Hope - \$16,000

The purpose of Beacon of Hope is to instill in ALL Lynchburg City Public School students the aspiration to pursue AND to provide them with the tools and resources to attain a post-secondary education. This is done by providing college opportunities for those would not be able to attend college otherwise, working to change the culture in the Lynchburg community to a PreK-16 division, creating a stream of qualified/ educationally prepared talent for the greater Lynchburg workforce, ensuring that all children who graduate from Lynchburg City Schools are prepared for the next step in life: 4 year college, 2 year college, technical/community/trade school, industry certification, and compiling and disseminating data on current and continuing post-secondary education of Lynchburg's students. Beacon of Hope works to plant the seeds of college attainability for younger students through mentoring programs, provision of scholarships, future centers in both Lynchburg public high schools that provide resources on financial aid and college admissions, and partnerships with local businesses to provide funding and internship opportunities. In fiscal year 2015, the Greater Lynchburg Community Trust provided \$16,000 in support of Beacon of Hope programs.

Types of Funds

The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust offers a variety of simple, flexible, and effective options for those who wish to provide financial support to our community through philanthropy.

Types of Funds:

Unrestricted Fund

Contributions made with no restrictions provide income for grants made by the Distribution Committee in response to requests from area non-profit organizations.

Field of Interest Fund

The donor specifies areas of interest (youth, elderly, education, arts, medical, etc.) to be supported by the fund.

Donor Designated Fund

At the time of establishing a fund the donor may name the organization(s) or institution(s) to be its beneficiaries.

Donor Advised Fund

The donor may from time to time suggest specific grants to be made from his/her fund.

Scholarship Fund

Enables donor to establish an endowment to fund annual scholarships.

Temporary Fund

Funds created when assets are delivered to the Community Trust with the expectation that they will ultimately be distributed for charitable purposes.

Operating Endowment

The income from this fund is used to help meet the Community Trust's operating costs, thereby increasing the amount available for charitable distribution.

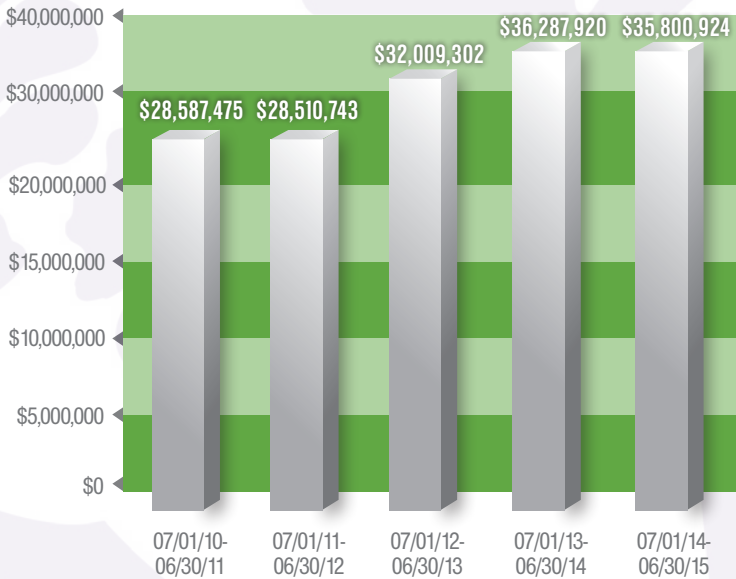

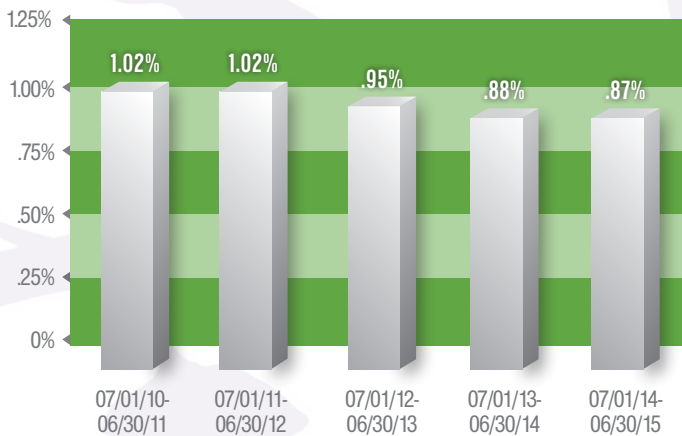

Total Investments:



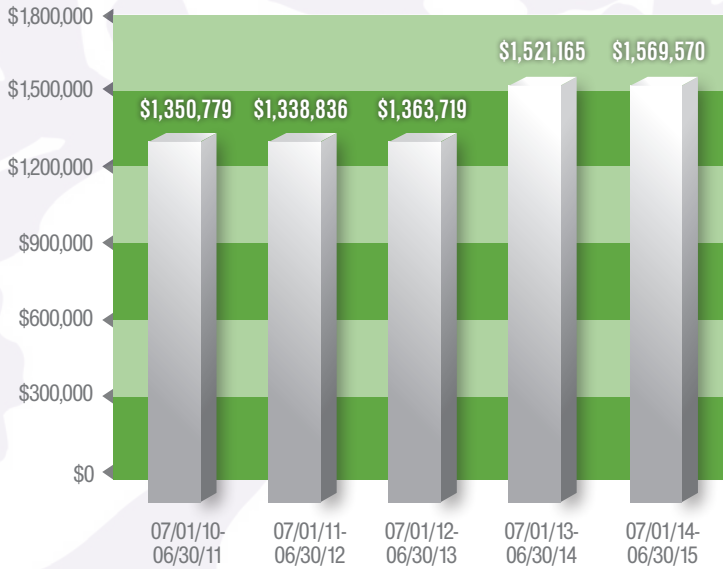
The Greater Lynchburg Community Trust was founded October 12, 1972 with three funds and a total value of \$14,000. Foundation assets have grown from \$702,000 on September 30, 1992 to \$35,800,924 by year-end June 30, 2015. The Foundation grew from 16 funds to 234 funds during the same period. We credit our success to our donors, volunteer board members and advisors who saw the value of the Greater Lynchburg Community Trust and encouraged their friends and clients to consider establishing long-term philanthropic funds with the Community Trust.

Operating Expenses as a Percent of Total Investments (Trailing Three-Year Average)



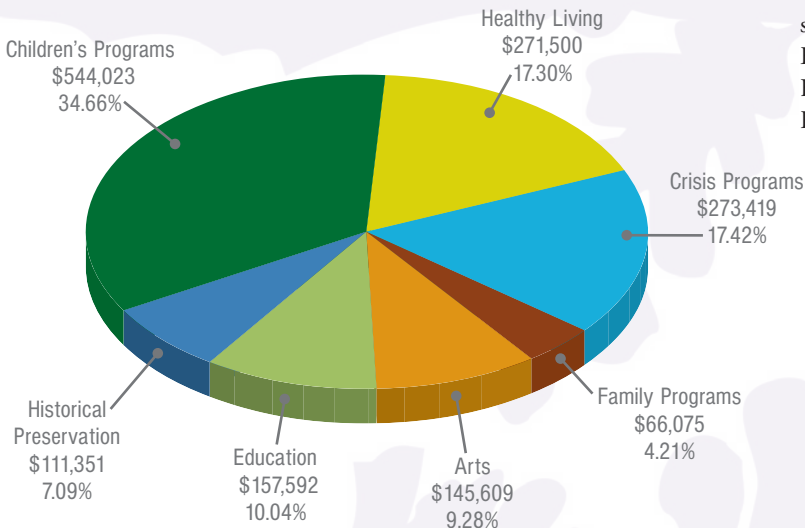
Keeping operating expenses to a minimum is a priority of the Greater Lynchburg Community Trust. This includes general and administrative costs, fund raising expenses, and program costs. Expenses as a percent of total investments have remained relatively stable. The one-year operating expense percent for FY 07/01/14 - 06/30/15 was .83%.

Annual grants awarded have increased 16.6% over the past five years. Our steady growth in foundation assets has enabled us to expand our grant-making dollars in order to meet critical needs in our communities.
