On SHARE Greater Lynchburg, agencies may be searched by category to find volunteer opportunities, events, and ways to donate, and to even send needed items via an Amazon wish list. It also serves to further our commitment to encourage collaboration and limit duplication of efforts so that resources may be employed as efficiently as possible.

The foundation has also partnered with the University of Lynchburg as part of their Lynchburg Tomorrow initiative to draw upon the

expertise and research capabilities there to better track outcomes as they relate to our grantmaking. This should help guide our funding decisions as we strive to make the greatest positive impact we can on our region.

As you can see, I'm proud of the way we have embraced these challenges and pledge to continue to seek creative new ways to enhance the lives of central Virginians while continuing to provide the support so many of our neighbors rely on.

Our Mission

The mission of the Greater Lynchburg Community Foundation is to enhance the quality of life in the communities served by establishment of permanent endowments for the city of Lynchburg and the counties of Amherst, Appomattox, Bedford and Campbell, with income distributed annually to charitable organizations within the community.

About the Foundation

The Greater Lynchburg Community Foundation provides for the administration and the investment of gifts and bequests for the benefit of the city of Lynchburg and the counties of Amherst, Appomattox, Bedford, and Campbell. Needs served are broad in scope including human services to children, youth, the needy, and the elderly through education, health, the arts, and the humanities.

The Foundation exists to promote local philanthropy and to simplify the process of giving. The Foundation receives and manages permanent gifts for the perpetual benefit of the Greater Lynchburg area.

The Greater Lynchburg Community Foundation currently consists of 275 special and unrestricted funds. Foundation assets are managed by: Truist, Bank of America, Wells Fargo, Flippin Bruce & Porter, CAPTRUST (formerly Davidson & Garrard) and Pettyjohn, Wood & White.

We are one of more than 850 community foundations across the nation rendering a valuable service to their respective communities and to donors interested in the present and future of their communities and their neighbors.








hree years ago, the foundation conducted a campaign to raise \$1 million and match it with \$1 million of our unrestricted funds, thereby creating a new fund we named the Century Fund. The purpose of this fund is to provide an annual grant of \$100,000 to a transformative project or initiative that is projected to significantly impact the community. While we have been distributing large numbers of smaller grants each year, usually in the range of \$2,000 to \$20,000, our board had a desire to create the capability to give one large grant each year to help an agency reach a worthy goal.

The foundation awarded the first Century Fund grant last year to the Free Clinic of Central Virginia to help with its renovation and expansion. This has helped enable the Free Clinic to expand and enhance its services to the local population who may not be able to access good health care otherwise and further serves to relieve some of the burden on hospital emergency rooms.

This past June, the Century Fund grant went to Camp Kum-Ba-Yah at Cosby Woods and was instrumental in enabling the camp to reach the point where it can purchase the land on which it sits. That 47 acres could have been sold to another buyer, but now Camp Kum-Ba-Yah can continue to bring children from all walks of life together as it has for 70 years to further racial and social understanding while exposing children to the great outdoors.



The Greater Lynchburg Community Foundation administers 283 individually named funds. These funds are etablished to support our community grantmaking, support organizations recommended by the donor, or provide ongoing support for one or more specified charitable ogranizations. Individual funds range from \$10,000 to over \$6 million, and they serve a wide range of community needs.

Beacon of Hope

Beacon of Hope's purpose is to instill in ALL Lynchburg City Public School students the aspiration to attain post-secondary education and to provide the tools and resources to do so. They strive to ensure that all children who graduate from Lynchburg City Schools are prepared for the next step in life including 4-year college, 2-year college, trade school, technical degrees, industry certifications, or military options. By doing so, the plan is to create a stream of qualified, educationally-prepared talent for the greater Lynchburg workforce and to improve the quality of life in our community by investing in our most precious resource - our children. This effort has been enhanced by the establishment of an endowment fund to ensure the growth and sustainability of Beacon of Hope's programs.

Old City Cemetery

(Pictured) The Southern Memorial Association, which oversees the Old City Cemetery, has entrusted the foundation with some of its funds as a way to grow them while maintaining the liquidity needed. Old City Cemetery is an extraordinary 27-acre public garden, "history park," and wedding venue located in the heart of Lynchburg, Virginia. Despite being an active place of burial and remembrance, it is one of the busiest and most popular attractions in the City. With more than 33,000 visitors annually, it is the most visited historic site in the City today. Established in 1806, Old City Cemetery is the oldest municipal cemetery in Virginia still in use today.

Pierce Street Gateway

Only two blocks long, and the smallest of Lynchburg's seven historic districts, the Pierce Street Renaissance District is the only local historic district that is more notable because of the people who lived there rather than because of the architecture of the buildings. The Pierce Street area was first settled in the 1850s but soon became a camp during the Civil War, followed by residential development after annexation by the City in 1870. The local district, established in 2005, was expanded in 2014 to include portions of the adjoining Buchanan and Fillmore Streets and is now on the Virginia Landmarks Register and the National Register of Historic Houses. Their new fund supports restoration efforts.

University Women of Bedford

University Women of Bedford empowers women and girls through advocacy, education, philanthropy, and research. It is a nonpartisan, nonprofit organization affiliated with a national association that has more than 170,000 members and supporters across the United States, as well as 1,000 local branches and 800 college and university partners. Its members have examined and taken positions on the fundamental issues of the day — educational, social, economic, and political. University Women of Bedford has established a scholarship fund with our foundation to support these aims.



In 2021, the Greater Lynchburg Community Foundation awarded \$1,915,412 to 168 charitable organizations. Our grants support the four major human service areas identified by our needs assessment study - Successful Children and Youth, Strengthening Families and Individuals, Healthy and Independent Living, and People in Crisis Receiving Help. In addition, our grants support the Arts, Education, and Historical Preservation.

Academy Center of the Arts

The Academy Center of the Arts is Greater Lynchburg's center for arts, culture, and community building. Its mission is to serve the community through arts and culture, and its leadership believes that arts programming is essential for a thriving community, as it can lead to improved grades for students, increased memory retention rates for seniors, and a decreased poverty rate, as well as serving to attract new businesses and visitors. Each year, the Academy engages tens of thousands of Central Virginians through stage events, arts education, facilities rentals, outreach, and galleries exhibits, which result in a significant economic impact on the Greater Lynchburg area. The Community Foundation is proud to support this important part of Lynchburg's arts scene.

Central Virginia United Soccer

(Pictured) CVU has been serving the greater Lynchburg area for over 40 years. They work closely with all our surrounding communities by providing teams, leagues, and camps with the goal of making soccer accessible and fun. A main goal is to instill a life-long passion for the sport in each and every player while aiding their social, physical and emotional development. The world of soccer is ever changing and CVU does all it can to continue to expose young players to exciting new opportunities. CVU is proud to represent all things Lynchburg and owes many thanks to the players and their families, our community, and local businesses for their support and generosity, allowing CVU to continue its mission of enriching the lives of so many young individuals.

National Center for Healthy Veterans

The Center, still under development near Altavista, will provide a natural healthy environment for veterans. Community is a primary antidote to isolation, loneliness, and broken relationships. Residents will experience a renewed sense of community and camaraderie in the National Center for Healthy Veteran villages and will form lasting bonds of friendship. Formerly homeless veterans will not only have a place to live, but also a place to thrive and contribute.

Veterans will live in private homes in a restorative community setting, which will include community design to ensure both privacy and community, a village community center for laundry, cooking, and social interaction, personal and village gardens to grow food and connect with the land, scenic views with access to hiking, kayaking, and other outdoor recreation, a working farm with horses and other livestock, and access to wellness resources and programs.

Neighbors Helping Neighbors

Neighbors Helping Neighbors of Amherst County's primary focus is to assist individuals in overcoming food insecurity by providing nutritious meals through food kitchens and selective shopping Food Warehouse. NHN started serving nutritious lunch meals on in May of 2016 to anyone who had a need for a meal that day during lunchtime. NHN Volunteers now prep and serve lunches twice a week.

NHN has expanded to two serving days (Wednesday & Thursday) as well as opening its Food Warehouse. They have served over 5,000 guests in their Food Kitchens and 850 households in the warehouse representing a total of 1500 people. In addition to assisting with food insecurity, NHN will serve as a resource hub that helps to connect those in need to area resources that can help build self-sufficiency and improve their quality of life.

Types of Funds

The Greater Lynchburg Community Foundation offers a variety of simple, flexible, and effective options for those who wish to provide financial support to our community through philanthropy.

Unrestricted Fund Contributions made with no restrictions provide income for grants made by the Distribution Committee in response to requests from area non-profit organizations.

Field of Interest Fund | The donor specifies areas of interest (youth, elderly, education, arts, medical, etc.) to be supported by the fund.

Donor Designated Fund At the time of establishing a fund the donor may name the organization(s) or institution(s) to be its beneficiaries.

Donor Advised Fund The donor may from time to time suggest specific grants to be made from his/her fund.

Scholarship Fund | Enables the donor to establish an endowment to fund annual scholarships.

Temporary Fund | Funds created when assets are delivered to the Community Foundation with the expectation that they will ultimately be distributed for charitable purposes.

uring its 49-year history, the Community Foundation has provided grants totaling over \$28 million to help those in need and to support the arts, education and historical preservation in Central Virginia. The committee reviewed 131 grant applications over the Fall cycle (Sept. 15 deadline) and the Spring cycle (March 15 deadline). 

Our Financials




The Greater Lynchburg Community Foundation was founded October 12, 1972 with three funds and a total value of \$14,000. Foundation investments have grown from \$702,000 on September 30, 1992 to \$56,553,941 by year end June 30, 2021. The Foundation grew from 16 funds to 283 funds during the same period. We credit our success to our donors, volunteer board members, and advisors who saw the value of the Greater Lynchburg Community Foundation and encouraged their friends and clients to consider establishing long-term philanthropic funds with the Community Foundation.


Operating Expenses as a Percent of Total Investments:

Keeping operating expenses to a minimum is a priority of the Greater Lynchburg Community Foundation. This includes general and administrative costs, fund raising expenses, and program costs. Expenses as a percent of total investments have remained relatively stable. The one-year operating expense percent for fiscal year 07/01/20-06/30/21 was 0.83%
